Essex Police Fraud Alert - INNOCENT SOCIAL MEDIA GAME OR CRIMINAL TOOLKIT?

Essex Police are reminding residents that what appear to be innocent games posted on social media have the potential to allow criminals access to your personal data—ultimately allowing them to get their hands on your money.

Local policing teams have recently identified an increase in Facebook posts encouraging users to post their 'Film Star Name' using a pet's name and mother's maiden name, or asking questions such as what was number one in the charts when you were 10.

These seemingly harmless questions can provide criminals with lots of personal information that can assist them with stealing your identity. For example:

What is your film star name?



First Pet and Mother's Maiden Name

- What was number one in the charts when you were 10?
 Allows criminals to work out your Date of Birth
- What car did you pass your driving test in?
 Details of first car
- Describe the city you were born in with a clue?
 Town of birth

All of these are potentially answers to bank account security questions.

Remember to **Take Five** before posting personal details on social media and make sure to check your security settings so that your posts can only be seen by those who you want to see them!

2) Temporary Road Closures

b) Trinity Road, Southend-On-Sea – 19th May 2021 for 4 days- Emergency Sewer Repairs

To facilitate emergency sewer repairs; they have imposed a prohibition of traffic in Trinity Road, Southend-On-Sea.

Weekly Briefing on Local Decisions & Actions re Coronavirus outbreak 21st May 2021

Key updates/actions

Vaccination:

With the vaccination roll-out underway, regular information is being updated on the EPUT website and the dedicated Essex COVID vaccine website. Figures are now also being reported by the national programme on a STP/ICS footprint – the latest weekly figures can be found at https://www.england.nhs.uk/statistics/statistical-work-areas/covid-19-vaccinations/. Seven in ten adults have now had their first dose of vaccine. Read more on GOV.UK. The NHS are now inviting 34 and 35 year olds to have their COVID-19 jab. Read more on NHS.UK.

Southend Community Testing Programme.

Everyone is being urged to use twice-weekly home testing kits. The Council's community testing programme is to close its two remaining rapid lateral flow device (LFD) assisted swabbing sites, as it moves towards encouraging testing at home for everyone.

Some local PCR testing sites are operating as collection points for symptom-free home testing kits. Kits may also be collected from selected pharmacies and local libraries.

Full details of all testing options are available at www.southend.gov.uk/gettested Testing is key to stop the spread and identify cases.

PCR sites:

In liaison with the DHSC, their managed mobile testing unit will move from Hamlet Court Road Car Park to Shoebury Park Car Park. This will enable a more equitable spread of PCR testing across Southend. The Hamlet Court Road site will close at the end of the day on Sunday 23rd May 2021. The new service will start in Shoebury Park on Monday 24th May and will be open from Monday-Friday between 09:30 and 15:00. Appointments will be bookable on the national system at: Get a free PCR test to check if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) and the service will also offer drive through testing. The other PCR sites in the Borough are at Southend Airport, Elm Road car park, Leigh-on-Sea, Short Street, central Southend.

Coronavirus case data:

COVID 19 Business Update -21/05/2021

Despite some restrictions relaxing over recent weeks, we need to continue to carefully manage COVID-19 risks if we are to reopen fully, successfully and safely. The Indian variant has been much reported in the press – it is more transmissible than other variants but the usual precautions and vaccinations are as effective against this variant as they are against all others. In short to stay safe there are a few things to bear in mind:

Financial Support

Additional Restrictions Grant (ARG) applications are now being accepted from businesses, including taxi drivers and those from the creative and cultural sector that have not received help support previously. You do not have to pay business rates to be eligible for ARG but you will have suffered losses due to the impacts of COVID-19 from 5 November 2020. Please note: applications for this grant stream are open until 28 May 2021, so make sure you apply before then if you think your business fits the criteria.

Restart Grants are now available to support non-essential retail, hospitality, accommodation, leisure, personal care and gym businesses in England. This support will take the form of a one-off grant funding scheme in Financial Year 2021-2022.

Reopening and working safely

If you want to demonstrate to visitors to your business that you take COVID testing seriously there is a new sticker scheme that allows you to easily show you are testing staff regularly.

To support outbreak management, some businesses must comply with the Collection of Contact Details Regulations which requires display of an NHS QR code poster and request that customers and visitors check in to your premises. If you have a confirmed COVID-19 case within your business, please refer to the Guidance and Action Card for your sector and contact the Health Protection Team on 01702 212497 or emailprovidecommunityaction@southend.gov.uk.

We strongly encourage all businesses, voluntary and community settings to complete and update Health & Safety Executive COVID-19 risk assessments. Assessments will help you:

Identify what work activity or situations might cause transmission of the virus

Think about who could be at risk

Decide how likely it is that someone could be exposed

Act to remove the activity or situation or if this isn't possible, control the risk

You might also seek additional guidance from a trade body, membership or sector leading organisation, such as the CITB or UK Hospitality.
