Tips on how to cope in hot weather from the NHS

It's important we look after each other, especially the young and the older generation. The NHS has some great advice on how to cope in a heatwave.

Use water wisely

Everyone wants to stay cool and have fun in the sun and their garden to look great, but there are so many ways you can do this without wasting water. Here are our top tips for saving water:

1. Reuse your water

We know school is out for summer and our furry friends love a good paddle, when the kids and pets have finished cooling down in the paddling pool, reuse it to water your flowerbeds or wash your car. You could even use the water to fill a couple of water blasters so the kids can have some extra fun and the garden gets a drink at the same time.

2. Don't water your grass



It has the magic power of going to sleep when it becomes very dry, unlike most other plants and it will come alive when moisture levels increase. Rainwater is also much more nutritious than tap water as it contains nitrogen that boosts growth. Plus, over watering encourages weed growth.

3. Use a watering can instead of a hose pipe

To water your plants and hanging baskets. A hose can use enough water to fill twelve baths every hour.

4. Water your plants in the morning

Before the sun gets too high in the sky. Not only does this minimise the risk of burning any leaves, but it also means you are wasting less water too. Try adding straw mulch to retain moisture and stop the soil from drying out too quickly.

2) National Corner

Cyclists may need number plates

Cyclists could reportedly be forced to have registration numbers, insurance and observe speed limits under a radical shake-up of road laws. There is said to be a growing belief among ministers that riders should abide by the same speed restrictions and other road rules as motorists.

Train strikes

Train passengers are facing disruption today with only 20 per cent of services running due to strike action. Half of Britain's lines will close on Thursday and Saturday and some places will have no services, and where they are operating, trains will only run between 7.30am and 6.30pm on both strike days.

Pay disputes

Millions of public sector workers are expected to vote on strike action over pay this autumn in what unions suggest could lead to the biggest wave of industrial action since the 1970s. The walkouts would see staff shortages in hospitals, fire stations,



schools and on the transport network, if negotiations over pay rises cannot be resolved.

Local press votes to strike

Journalists at the Mirror, Express and regional newspapers have voted to strike next month in a dispute over pay. They will stop work for four days over the next month after staff turned down a pay offer of a 3 per cent pay rise, arguing it is not enough to cope with the cost of living crisis.

Schools consider three-day week

School leaders are considering three or four-day weeks to pay for rising energy costs. Headteachers, trustees and governors are holding meetings during the summer holidays to work out how to keep schools afloat in the autumn term.

Grant Shapps: Introduce a £2 bus fare cap to ease cost of living burden Every bus journey would have a £2 fare cap to help people cope with the cost of living crisis, under plans being drawn up by the Transport Secretary Grant Shapps. Mr Shapps is proposing a £260 million taxpayers' subsidy to cut the cost of bus journeys that would save £3 on a single ticket for hard-pressed families.

'Overwhelmed' food banks unable to cope with unprecedented demand Food banks are being overwhelmed and unable to cope with unprecedented demand and are being forced to turn away families in need as more people are falling into hardship as a result of the cost of living crisis. Several managers have said they were forced to have a "painful" discussion about caps on the number of people they can help as they ran out of food this summer.

Online scams

There has been a rise in scams targeting younger people, research has shown. BBC's Rip Off Britain cited LGA research which found that 20 per cent of 16-34 year olds had fallen victim to a scam compared to just 4 per cent of over 55's.

Covid booster jab gets date

A new booster dose which targets both the original strain of COVID-19 and the Omicron variant will be rolled out across England from 5 September as part of the autumn booster campaign. Care home residents and those who are housebound will be among the first of the 26 million people eligible to receive a dose of Moderna's bivalent vaccine later this year.
