Southend's director of public health says 'do your bit' to support the NHS and social care this winter

Southend-on-Sea City Council's director of public health, says 'do your bit' to support the NHS and social care this winter and get your COVID-19 and flu vaccinations.

This year, the flu vaccine will be offered to those most at risk from flu first. From September, younger children, older people, those in clinical risk groups and pregnant



women were able to book an appointment for a flu vaccine at their GP practice or pharmacy. From mid-October 2022, people aged 50 to 64 years old that aren't in a clinical risk group, will also be able to get a free flu vaccine. The flu vaccine is offered through schools for school-aged children and pregnant women can get their flu vaccine through their GP practice, pharmacy or maternity service.

The COVID-19 and flu vaccine can be given on the same day and some people might get both vaccines at the same time. However, this may not always be possible, so it's best to get each vaccination as soon as possible, rather than waiting to get both at the same time.

Please plan your travel for seafront fireworks

With train strikes and engineering works this weekend, Southend-on-Sea City Council is asking residents and visitors attending Southend Business Improvement District's (BID) free firework display to plan their travel in advance.

There is planned nationwide strike action affecting both C2C and Greater Anglia rail lines on Saturday 8 October, which is also the first weekend of the Southend BID's annual free firework display along the seafront. Although a reduced service will run between 7.30am and 6.30pm, both local operators are warning of severe disruption and advise not travelling on their networks.

To avoid traffic and parking issues, Southend-on-Sea City Council are urging those attending to plan ahead with their journey, use bus networks, and if driving leave plenty of time and use the City Centre car parks, then walk to the seafront.

'Dental deserts' across England growing, Local Government Association (LGA) analysis shows

The number of "dental deserts" is growing across England, according to new analysis by the LGA. Deprived and rural areas have fewer dentists than richer and urban areas, with the LGA saying the Government must address shortages in NHS



dentistry. The new analysis of data, collected by the Care Quality Commission and published as a rate per 1,000 residents on the LGA's data platform LG Inform, shows no local authority area in the country has more than one dentist providing NHS treatment per 1,000 people. The LGA said the public health grant, which is used by councils to provide programmes to promote good oral health, has been cut by 24 per cent in real terms since 2015/16, equivalent to a total reduction of £1 billion.

COVID-19 cases double in a month to 200,000 a day

Latest figures show the number of COVID-19 cases has doubled to 200,000 a day again – and are expected to hit a new UK record around the end of the month. Daily symptomatic cases have doubled in just over a month, increasing from 101,600 on 27 August to 202,738 on 30 September according to the ZOE Health study.

'Concerning' increases in Covid hospitalisations - with 250% rise in one region "Concerning" increases in Covid hospitalisations in the past week suggest a new wave of infections is underway, UK health officials have said. There were 9,631 people in hospital with coronavirus as of 8am on 5 October, a 37 per cent increase on last week's 7,024, which is also the highest figure since 3 August and the COVID-19 hospital admission rate in England is now 10.8 per 100,000 people.

Junk food banned from tills and entrances in shops across England from 1st October

Restrictions on where shops in England can display junk food come into effect 1st October. Products which are high in fat, salt and sugar can no longer be placed in prominent locations such as shop entrances and tills, but a proposed ban on multibuy deals for junk food - such as "buy one, get one free" offers - is being delayed until October 2023.

Teachers plan strikes this winter

Hundreds of thousands of teachers are poised to strike before Christmas over subinflation pay rises, in a move that threatens to shut schools across England. Internal figures compiled by the National Education Union, the country's largest education union, suggest as many as nine in ten teachers are prepared to back industrial action.

Nurses to vote on strike action

Nurses are set to cast their votes on whether to strike over pay in the first ever UKwide ballot by the industry's largest union, with the Royal College of Nursing asking its members if they want to implement industrial action for the first time. It comes amid warnings that record numbers of nurses are leaving the profession.

Rule on nursery staff ratios may be axed by Truss

Liz Truss could abolish rules on the number of nursery staff required to look after children in a drive to make childcare cheaper. The Prime Minister has spoken in the past about relaxing ratios governing how many adults are needed per child in English nurseries and rather than tweaking the ratios, Ms Truss is now considering scrapping the regulation altogether and leaving nurseries free to decide how many staff they need to look after their children.
