On May 15, 1948 Don Bradman's Invincibles amassed 721 in a single day against Essex at Southendon-Sea. **Abhishek Mukherjee** looks back at the highest score ever in a single day in a First-Class match.

In his autobiography, Richie Benaud had advised upcoming commentators to abstain from using words like 'catastrophe or 'disaster since they typically refer to events like natural calamities, wars, riots, and the likes. Anything on a cricket ground could not come close in comparison.

It is tempting, though, to use words of the same magnitude while describing the thrashing Australia had dished out Essex 65 years back. A total of 721 in 6 hours is no joke: true, Essex bowled at a rate of 21.3 overs an hour, but it must not be forgotten that the Australians had scored at the rate of 5.59 per over which is phenomenal even by today s standards over a full day. In fact, boundaries became so commonplace in the afternoon that Jack Fingleton was forced to notice that "the afternoon sun was not long on its downward path before boundaries were being received in complete silence."

The build-up

The Australians were on a roll from the very moment they set foot on English soil. In the traditional opening match, they had beaten Worcestershire at New Road by an innings and 17 runs; they followed it by defeating Leicestershire at Grace Road by an innings and 171 runs, Yorkshire by four wickets at

Energy bill support to be extended

Government support for energy bills is expected to continue for three months from April, protecting consumers from an average increase of £500. The Chancellor Jeremy Hunt will cancel a reduction in support that would have seen typical annual bills rise from £2,500 to £3,000.

Consultants want three-times basic pay to cover strikes

Consultant doctors want at least three times their basic pay to provide emergency cover for junior doctors during this month's strike. The British Medical Association is recommending its members ask for £158 an hour to work during the day, rising to £262 for night shifts.

Ambulance strikes in England called off

Ambulance strikes due to take place in England today and on Wednesday have been called off. The Unite union said it suspended the industrial action to enter pay talks with the Government and followed the Unison and GMB unions earlier suspending walkouts, after what they called a "huge shift" in the Government's position.

Rail fares rise

Regulated rail fares in England and Wales are set to rise by up to 5.9 per cent, an increase above last year's 4.8 per cent hike but far below the rate of inflation. Some groups have said that after months of poor services and strikes, passengers are not getting value for money.

Extra time in pubs for coronation

Pubs, clubs and bars will stay open two hours longer over the weekend of King Charles III's coronation. Regular licensing hours will be extend from the normal 23:00 BST to 01:00 to allow people to celebrate the coronation of the new King.

Law to create duty to remove illegal arrivals

A new law is to place a duty on the Home Secretary to remove anyone who enters the UK by an illegal route. A bill is expected to be introduced today which would also prevent those arriving illegally from claiming asylum or returning to the UK in future.

Firefighters vote to accept new pay offer

Firefighters have accepted a new pay offer, ending the prospect of strike action. The settlement is for a 7 per cent increase backdated to July 2022, plus an additional 5 per cent from July 2023.
