Scammers are looking to take advantage of this and are offering fake fast track passport services claiming for a fee they can make sure you get it on time for your holiday.

They might even be offering a great holiday deal with the promise of a quick passport renewal thrown in.

Stay scam savvy by reading online reviews from reputable sources before booking any holidays and when renewing a passport, only use the government's official website.

Council and police joint operation to crack down on e-scooters and cycling on Southend High Street

Southend-on-Sea City Council's Community Safety team and The Southend Community Policing Team were in Southend city centre on Thursday 25 May to educate the public about the dangers of e-scooters and cycling on Southend High Street.

After many complaints about reckless cyclists and the illegal riding of e-scooters on and around the High Street, which can be intimidating for some people and also very dangerous, the joint operation will also be used to enforce the terms of a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) to keep everyone safe.

Southend-on-Sea City Council introduced the PSPO in 2019 and it was renewed last year to include two additional restrictions to allow fines to be issued to people cycling or using e-scooters in a way that has a negative effect or poses a risk to pedestrians.



New signage has also been installed around Southend city centre and all routes onto the High Street notifying people that cycling and e-scooting on the High Street and anywhere in the PSPO area is prohibited.

A previous joint operation (24 April) saw three fixed penalty notices (FPNs) issued for cycling, two for begging and one for littering. Two of the FPNs have since been paid and, as no appeals have been received for the outstanding FPN, legal action is underway. Since the April operation, two additional FPNs have been issued by community safety officers with one being paid in full and the other being paid in instalments.

Galleon ship stays ashore for longer due to popular demand

The company that owns El Galeon, the 17th century replica Spanish tall ship due to arrive at Southend Pier this week has lengthened its stay due to popular demand.

Unfortunately due to weather predictions the floating museum ship is now expected to arrive at the head of the Pier of the Year on Wednesday 24 May, and will open to the public on Thursday 25 May, but will remain until Sunday 4 June.

Since Southend-on-Sea City Council announced the ship would be arriving at the pier, it has proved so popular that advanced online tickets have been released to manage the number of visitors aboard.

Because so many advanced tickets have now been sold the company have extended the visit throughout the half term holiday, so residents and visitors have extra opportunities to take advantage of this unique experience.

Those who have already bought advanced tickets for Wednesday, can contact the booking office for a refund or transfer to a different day.

El Galeon is open to visitors between 11am to 7pm. Museum staff in period costume will be on hand to tell visitors more about life on the ship.

Tickets are £25 for a family ticket (for up to two adults and three children), £10 per adult, £5 per child (aged five to 12 years) and children under five go free. You can book in advance at: 'El Galeon' Visiting Southend Pier | Southend Pier. Advance tickets are sold in euros and there is a 1.50 euro booking fee. Visitors who want to pay with gold doubloons (or cash) on the day and in person, can do so.

You will also need to pay the usual pier admission price to walk the planks of the pier.

The Blackwater Pirate Crew will be visiting on the Saturday 27 May, between 12 and 4pm to help landlubbers really get into the spirit of the high seas. They will be posing for photos at the pierhead and raising money for Little Havens Children's Hospice

The floating museum is a full-size replica of a 17th century Spanish galleon, which was designed and built to hold more cargo from the East and is often described as the ship that brought the two halves of the world together.



The visit comes following the recent announcement that Southend Pier won the prestigious Pier of the Year, from the National Piers Society earlier this month.

Aside from admiring the ship, whilst on the pier you can also enjoy the view and refreshments at the 'Tea with the Tide' tearoom and the newly re-opened Pavilion with 'Lazy Jacks' café and the 'Offshore' restaurant and bar offering a selection of food and drinks.

You can also visit the Southend Pier Museum at the shore end and find out more about the history of the world's longest pleasure pier. The museum is open to visitors on Friday 26 May to Monday 29 May and Friday 2 June to Sunday 4 June.

Patients will be able to use NHS app 'to opt for private hospital care'

Patients will soon be able to use the NHS app to opt for private hospital treatment in an effort to cut waiting times, it is reported. The NHS waiting list for routine treatment stands at more than seven million and is predicted to keep rising until next spring.

Britain set for mini-heatwave with temperatures up to 25C

Britain is set for a mini-heatwave with above-average temperatures expected to stay until June. Forecasters say the UK will see the hottest day of the year on Thursday as temperatures reach 25C (77F) in southwest England.

High lead and nickel levels found in school vapes

An investigation has found vapes confiscated from school pupils contain high levels of lead, nickel and chromium. The results showed children using them could be inhaling more than twice the daily safe amount of lead, and nine times the safe amount of nickel.

NHS dentist numbers at lowest level in a decade

Figures show the number of active NHS dentists in England is at its lowest level in a decade. The British Dental Association is warning of an exodus in dentists from the NHS, as it published figures showing the workforce has been reduced to a level not seen since 2012/13.

Junior doctors in England announce new three-day strike

Junior doctors in England have announced a new three-day strike in June. It comes after the latest round of government pay talks broke down. The strike will take place between 7am on Wednesday 14 June and 7am on Saturday 17 June.

Pothole-related breakdowns

Breakdowns caused by potholes have risen by almost a third in the last year, according to figures from the AA. The motoring group helped more than 52,000 people whose vehicles were damaged by potholes in April, around 1,700 a day.



Private cancer check centres

Private health companies will reportedly run cancer check centres for NHS patients in an attempt to reduce backlogs. The Prime Minister is expected to announce the expansion of patient choice on Thursday, with the NHS app reportedly allowing people to choose where they are treated, including in private hospitals.

UK not heading for recession

The UK is no longer predicted to fall into recession this year, but tax cuts could still fuel inflation and result in a long period of high interest rates, according to the International Monetary Fund (IMF). The IMF now forecast the country's gross domestic product to grow by 0.4 per cent this year, up from its April estimate of a 0.3 per cent contraction.

Ofgem energy price cap cut expected to revive switching of suppliers

Competitively priced fixed energy deals are due to return to the market in light of the fall in the energy price cap. Consumer affairs organisation Uswitch had expected deals to return in the coming weeks but are not expecting a "deluge".

Congestion on UK roads expected over weekend

The highest levels of congestion on UK roads since 2019 is expected this weekend according to the RAC, with traffic likely to peak on Friday afternoon when leisure trips and commuting coincide. The UK is due to experience warm weather as the bank holiday break coincides with the half term holidays.

GPs urged to trial experimental drugs on patients

Patients should be given experimental drugs by their GPs to speed up access to new medicine, a new government commissioned report has found. The report calls for a raft of reforms which include financial incentives for GPs who carry out community drugs and treatments trials on their patients at local surgeries or in their own homes.
