# 60 street parties planned across the City for Coronation



Over sixty applications have been received for street party permits and road closures to celebrate King Charles III's coronation weekend.

A full list of road closures will be published ahead of the Coronation, so residents who are planning to travel over that period can plan their route ahead of the three-day bank holiday weekend.

Residents who don't have a party planned but want to celebrate locally, can join a host of events being run across the City, including Music in the Park at Priory Park on Saturday 6 May, where people will hear Southend Community Chorus sing uplifting songs, supported by the fantastic Southend Band. Bring a picnic and make the most of this Royal celebration. No need to book, this is a free event, and everyone is welcome.

Ironworks at 90 High Street, Southend-on-Sea are holding a Coronation event on Sunday 7 May inside and outside their building. Running from 11am to 3pm, there will be music, games, artists, stalls food and drink.

A Coronation Tea Dance taking place at The Haven Community Hub on Thursday 4 May from 2 to 4pm and a Coronation Cream Tea being held on Sunday 7 May at Prittlewell Priory from 11am to 3pm.

As part of the celebrations, the council has also commissioned five coronation plaques from The British Ironworks Centre, to mark this historic moment. The centre is donating all profits to charity and these will be put up in the Civic Centre, Porters Civic House, The Forum, The Royal Pavilion on Southend Pier and The Cliffs Pavilion.

There is also the national campaign, The Big Help, introduced to mark the King's coronation and leave a lasting community legacy by working with national and local charities by volunteering. # Nurses in England walk out in biggest strike so far

Nurses in England are taking part in a fresh strike, which has been described as their biggest walkout so far. The strike by Royal College of Nursing members affects half of England's NHS trusts and will last until midnight on Monday.



# Food prices increase

Food prices in the UK continued to increase in April despite a drop in wholesale costs, new figures show. The British Retail Consortium said food inflation increased to 15.7 per cent last month compared with April in 2022, up from 15 per cent in March, but said the cost of a food shop "should start" to come down in the next few months.

#### Calls for additional school nurses

There have been calls for an additional 11,000 school nurses to help young people with complex needs after the pandemic, a report by Oxford Brookes University, the University of Birmingham and the Oxford Health NHS foundation trust has found. The report cited previous LGA calls for funding for one school nurse per high school and one per cluster of primary schools, which would equate to 25,000.

#### Majority of NHS workers accept pay deal

NHS workers will receive pay rises of at least 5 per cent and a lump sum bonus this summer after the majority of their unions accepted a government pay offer. The NHS Staff Council, made up of 14 unions, recommended that the deal be implemented.

#### Energy suppliers to set up dedicated phone lines for vulnerable households

Energy regulator Ofgem is due to require all energy suppliers to set up a dedicated phoneline for vulnerable customers, it has been reported. Ofgem will today (3<sup>rd</sup>) launch a consultation on methods to improve their service and the regulator wants to see improvements in place ahead of next winter.

# Bank closures prompt calls for High Street hubs

The UK should open more shared banking hubs to help those who feel uncomfortable managing their finances online, charity Age UK has said. The charity's research suggests 27 per cent of over-65s and 58 per cent of over-85s rely on faceto-face banking. Charities and consumer groups have called for an acceleration in the introduction of banking hubs, when all branches have closed in an area.

#### **Coronation bunting**

Some councils have advised their residents of the permissions needed to fly flags and buntings safely ahead of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. A spokesperson for the LGA said: "Displays of bunting and flags are not banned, but should not be placed above roads or over signs or pylons because of risks related to them falling and distracting road traffic. Any displays should be kept at a low level and be well fastened."

#### **Measles concern**

Health officials have reported a concerning rise in the number of people catching measles in the UK. The UK Health Security Agency is encouraging parents to ensure their children's vaccinations are up to date.

#### Further RMT action agreed

RMT members have voted to back further strikes. Industrial action across 14 train operating companies could continue until November, with this vote being the third time workers have come out in favour of strike action since May last year.
