Annual household canvass

This year's annual household canvass begins on 19th July. Emails and letters will be going out to residents and households from this date. Canvass emails will be sent from electoral@southend.gov.uk

The annual household canvass is a statutory registration exercise that supports the maintenance of the register of electors. Following the conclusion of the canvass in November, the register of electors is re-sequenced and published on 1st December.

Construction partner announced for multi-million pound upgrade to Cliffs Pavilion - A resident event is being held on Monday 17 July at 7pm in the Maritime Room

- Venue will remain open throughout the planned renovation
- Upgrade will secure future of Cliffs Pavilion as one of the top ten regional theatres
- Work set to commence in January 2024 subject to planning permission
- Resident event taking place on Monday 17 July at 7pm

Willmott Dixon has been announced as the council's construction partner for the proposed major upgrade of the Cliffs Pavilion.

This follows a procurement process, with the City Council entering into a preconstruction agreement with the national construction and property services company.

Willmott Dixon will do all design development, a pre-construction health and safety plan and a construction methodology and programme including phasing. It is also intended to enter into a full contract with Wilmott Dixon subject to planning approval, an agreed cost plan and agreed works programme that enables the Cliffs Pavilion to stay open for performances throughout the works. Upgrades to the Cliffs Pavilion Theatre will help secure the long-term future of the theatre, which is owned by the council and operated by Trafalgar Theatres (for Trafalgar Entertainment) and will ensure the venue's position as one of the top ten regional theatres in the country.

Over £8m is set to be invested into the theatre, which will see the major expansion of the restaurant, a new entrance and lobby to improve the customer experience, upgraded ventilation, a new outdoor piazza and several other improvements to the bars, toilets, lifts and other areas.

The theatre will remain open throughout the works, which are expected to take place from January 2024, with several major shows already booked in for that year including SIX The Musical, The Full Monty, I Should Be So Lucky, Pretty Woman The Musical, Diversity, Professor Brian Cox and Romesh Ranganathan.

£5.5m of the project is being funded through Round 1 of the Levelling Up Fund announced by Government on 27 October 2021, with additional investment from the City Council and Trafalgar Entertainment.



A revised planning application is required, after previous proposals were deemed unviable due to rising construction and labour costs linked to rising inflation and energy costs. This will be submitted shortly. A resident event is also being held on Monday 17 July at 7pm in the Maritime Room where residents and businesses will be able to view the new plans for the project and speak to the design team.

The Cliffs Pavilion and The Palace Theatre are both council-owned assets and more than 500,000 people enjoy shows at the venues, as part of the current contract with Trafalgar Theatres, which runs until 2036. The last major renovation to the Cliffs Pavilion was in 1992 when the balcony was installed.

Fraudsters exploit easyJet customers affected by cancellations

Customers affected by easyJet's latest flight cancellations are being bombarded on Twitter by fake customer service accounts. Although some of the accounts have been shut down, five were found that are still active.

Some of these accounts included dodgy links to an 'online help hub' in their bio. These lead to phishing websites where scammers try to obtain your personal information.

Taylor Swift ticket scams

Taylor Swift's 2024 UK tour is set to go on sale, and scammers will be looking to take advantage of fans who miss out on tickets.

If you don't get tickets in the general sale, you may be tempted to turn to resellers. However, fraudsters can create fake websites and images to deceive buyers into thinking they're purchasing legitimate tickets.

Did you know that in 2022, £6.7m was lost to ticket fraud? Be cautious of potential ticket scams when purchasing event tickets online.

Thanks for binning your rubbish, babes

Veolia and Southend-on-Sea City Council have joined forces to tackle the issue of litter on the seafront with their newly launched "Just Bin It" campaign.

The campaign promotes a cleaner and more environmentally friendly Southend-on-Sea with talking bins and glow-in-the-dark signs.

The Veolia-funded Big Belly bins will be at prime seafront locations all summer and are equipped with smart technology, allowing them to compact waste and provide live information on how full they are. Best of all, they celebrate every time someone uses them by playing music, from Funk to Drum and Bass!

Glow-in-the-dark stickers featuring positive playful slogans such as "Thanks for binning your rubbish, babes" have also been placed on other bins along the seafront, particularly in high footfall areas such as Marine Parade and Western Esplanade. The neon stickers will help people find the bins after dark and remind them to dispose of their rubbish appropriately.



Elsewhere, bins will have new signs, reminding visitors to take their rubbish home with them in the event that the bin is already full. These signs feature a QR code so people can report a full bin on the Council's My Southend portal.

The "neon" design approach, eye-catching posters and banners along the seafront are targeting both tourists and locals alike. Local traders are encouraged to participate in the campaign too by displaying posters and promoting the importance of keeping the seafront clean for everyone to enjoy.

Keep an eye out for fun anti-litter memes and informative content across social media encouraging the public to share their commitment to a cleaner Southend-on-Sea through their own posts using the hashtag #JustBinIt.

2) National Corner

Driving fines

Nearly 40 councils are set to be given new legal powers next month which will allow them to impose fines on drivers who commit offences like entering yellow box junctions or driving through 'no entry signs'. The RAC has called on drivers to be on their guard to avoid the fines. An LGA spokesperson said: "Councils have been calling for powers to make our roads safer and less congested for all road users. Powers to enforce against moving traffic offences, such as banned turns, weight restricted roads and yellow box junctions will help to keep local roads moving and make our air cleaner."

Mortgage payments to rise

Mortgage payments will rise by at least £500 a month for nearly one million households by the end of 2026, according to the Bank of England. In a report, the Bank said mortgage holders "may struggle with repayments" on loans.

Households struggling with bills

A survey by Which? found an estimated 1.3 million households in the UK have defaulted on or failed to pay for an essential bill in a single month due to struggles with living costs. They found that 60 per cent of those who could not afford a household bill such as energy, water or council tax had defaulted on more than one payment in the month.

Teacher strikes

Teacher strikes could hit schools in England again, after a second education union voted to walk out over pay. Teaching unions in England want an above-inflation pay rise that is funded by the Government rather than coming out of schools' existing budgets.

Government makes public sector pay offer

More than one million public sector workers, including teachers, police and doctors, have been offered pay rises of between 5 per cent and 7 per cent. Four education unions said the deal would allow them to end their dispute and will be recommending their members to accept the offer.
