Scammers posing as police officers

A Which? member was recently cold called by a scammer who pretended to be a police officer. The scammer claimed that the police had arrested someone who had used the member's bank card. When asked for further details, the scammer became aggressive and ended the call.

It's important to remember that the police will never ask for personal or financial information over unsolicited calls.

Borrowers targeted by dodgy £30-a-month 'savings' sites

People searching for loans online are unknowingly signing up for £29.95 a month subscriptions to websites they've never heard of.

Which? have received reports of 13 different 'savings' websites appearing on bank statements (see below). These websites claim to offer daily discount codes, exclusive deals, cashback, and assistance with rebuilding bad credit.

Gas prices rise to highest level since February

UK wholesale gas prices have risen again and are now at their highest level since mid-February. Prices rose to nearly 135 pence a therm on Friday afternoon and



comes after gas costs hit a six-month high of nearly 123p a therm on Tuesday afternoon - a level not seen since early April.

Covid could become 'just regular winter bug'

Covid is "well on the way" to becoming seasonal, with flu likely to cause more deaths from now on, according to an infectious-diseases expert. Prof Paul Hunter of the University of East Anglia said immunity to serious illness built up from vaccination and infection means the death rate per Covid infection is now well below that of flu and that eventually, Covid will become "just another cause of the common cold", like the other coronaviruses that circulate.

Households at risk of losing winter energy help, charity warns

Fuel poverty activists are warning hundreds of thousands of struggling households in Great Britain risk missing out on government help to pay their energy bills this winter if they fail to make an application for financial support that opens on Monday.

Laughing gas illegal in three weeks

Possessing laughing gas will be made illegal in three weeks, with those who repeatedly misuse the drug facing up to two years in prison. The ban will come into force on November 8, and will make nitrous oxide a controlled Class C drug under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971.

Early release of prisoners

Prisoners are to be released early from a fifth of the prisons in England and Wales in an attempt to ease the overcrowding crisis. Ministry of Justice figures show nearly half of them are technically 100 per cent full with fewer than 10 spare places.

Record use of food parcels expected

More than one million emergency parcels are expected to be distributed by food banks this winter due to an "unprecedented need" for help. The Trussell Trust has forecast that more than 600,000 people will rely on food banks from December this year until next February.

Water quality

Stricter limits are needed on levels of 'forever chemicals' in UK drinking water which are potentially harmful to human health, the Royal Society of Chemistry has warned. In high doses these pollutants, known as PFAS, have been linked to serious health concerns including cancer and fertility issues.
