# 2) Scam Alerts

We have been contacted by a member as one of his bank accounts was recently scammed. He never gave out any of his personal details to anybody over the phone or on the internet.

However, prior to him being scammed he received an email from his bank, Lloyds, bank to ask if he could confirm his correct telephone number, as an additional one had been applied to his account which they were not aware of. This request came through on the bank's own formal heading. He replied and confirmed his telephone number.

A week later he got four text messages telling him that he had registered for Mobile Banking which was not the case. He contacted the bank and the account was immediately frozen and he was told he would have to go into the branch to sort this out, which he did.



The bank informed him that nine payments of around £800 had been withdrawn and there were further payments requested that would have cleared that particular account out £12,000 in total. He explained to the bank that he had never given any details out or spoken to anybody about this account apart from confirming his telephone number with them directly, or so he thought.

It would appear that the scammers had been phishing Lloyds business at the time and his conversation had allowed them somehow to infiltrate the system to gain access to accounts.

Fortunately for the member the bank refunded the account. But the lesson is very simple. Do not accept any requests of any nature. If you get one take it into the bank and deal with it face to face.

## Plan for UK to host thousands of Gaza refugees drawn up by charities

A plan setting out how Britain could provide refuge to thousands of Palestinians from Gaza has been drawn up by a coalition of charities and groups. The organisations are urging the Government to introduce an emergency family reunion scheme modelled on the initiative for Ukrainians and carry out a medical evacuation for people in need of specialist care.

#### Conservatives stop using hotels in election battlegrounds for migrants

The Government is to stop using 100 hotels for migrants as Prime Minister Rishi Sunak makes a series of announcements on immigration. Contracts will be terminated with hotels in a host of areas that will be key election battleground seats.



### **Recycling standardisation**

Recycling is to be standardised from 2026 with councils collecting the same materials and food waste collected at least once a week. Councils will all collect the same glass, metal, plastic and card, food waste and garden waste under government plans to encourage recycling. The LGA said it was pleased the Government had "decided not to significantly reduce the flexibilities in how councils collect waste from people's homes".

## Higher energy bills forecast for households

Analysis by Cornwall Insight have found that households could face higher energy bills next year. They found that prices would rise from an average of £96.64 per megawatt-hour (MWh) so far this year to £129/MWh next year because of higher gas prices due to the war in Ukraine.

## **Building on flood plains**

Campaigners are warning that since 2013, more than 10 per cent of all new homes in England have been built on land at highest risk of flooding. National planning guidelines say that building on flood plains "should be avoided" because of the risk to the developments and of exacerbating flooding elsewhere in the area.

#### Four day week

The Government have published new guidance telling councils that are currently running four day a week working patterns to end these immediately. Cllr Pete Marland, Chair of the LGA's Resources board, said: "More than nine in 10 councils are experiencing staff recruitment and retention difficulties across a diverse range of skills, professions and occupations. It is councils who know what works best for their community, workforce and in their wider labour market conditions. They should be free to pilot innovative solutions to address local challenges and deliver crucial services to their residents. Local voters should be the ones making a judgment on whether local council leaders have made good choices and delivered value for local taxpayers."

## **NHS** waiting lists

A report by the Health Foundation has found that NHS waits could exceed eight million by the summer. Their analysis found that despite monthly referrals being at pre-pandemic levels, the number of treatments does not yet exceed the number of referrals.
